

25 Pretty Awesome Things We Did in 2019

1. Winnipeg General Strike. It was the 100th anniversary of the 1919 Winnipeg General Strike and sympathetic strikes across BC. <u>Listen to a union seaman</u> who arrived in Vancouver during the 1919 strike.





- 2. **Focus on Prince Rupert.** Our new Prince Rupert Labour History Walking Tour is now available for download on our "<u>BC Labour History Walking Tours App</u>".
- 3. Original BCLHC research **walked us through** the <u>1919 Prince Rupert General</u> Strike.
- 4. We conducted nine <u>Oral History interviews</u> with current and past <u>union activists in Prince Rupert</u>.
- 5. We shared the story of Prince Rupert's Labour Watchdog, George Casey (1876-1962).
- 6. Proceeds and royalties from the sale of "On the Line: A History of the British Columbia Labour Movement" were used to put a copy in every public secondary school in the province.
- 7. Our **social media posts** reached over 100,000 users. An audience favourite: that time in 1975 when <u>Led</u> <u>Zeppelin became Part of the [CUPE] Union.</u>

- 8. Rod Mickleburgh received **The George Ryga Award for Social Awareness** for
 On the Line: A History of the British
 Columbia Labour Movement. Read Rod's
 exceptional acceptance speech.
- 9. We told you about **Emmitt Holmes**, the only black member of the Vancouver Local of the International Woodworkers of America (IWA Local 1-217) in 1944.
- 10. The **Labor Arts Guild** organized two Vancouver Art Gallery exhibits in 1944 and 1945 in Vancouver. Read the story.
- 11. Our <u>virtual exhibit</u> produced for the Canadian Museum of History's Virtual Museum has been published. "Solidarity: The Largest Political Protest in BC's History" will be online for five years.
- 12. **Solidarity Times**, published in 1983, has been digitized.
- 13. The **Grant De Patie** story has been an inspiration to young workers to take up the fight for workplace safety.

- 14. The feminist **Association of University and College Employees** (AUCE) at UBC won the <u>first fully funded maternity benefits</u> in a collective agreement in 1974.
- 15. A tragedy in 1909 killed 23 **Japanese railway workers** in Burnaby. <u>The story says</u> <u>much</u> about working conditions and racial discrimination in BC's early history.
- 16. Working People Built BC! Over 190 locations of importance to working people in BC have now been mapped on our website.
- 17. A conference and a workshop for 100+ teachers and union educators shared our extensive resource of videos and lesson plans on BC labour history.
- 18. We hosted our first <u>BC Labour History Boat Tour of Burrard Inlet</u> with a trip around **Vancouver's working waterfront**.
- 19. Strong, democratic, socially conscious and passionate: the **Hospital Employees' Union** became our **newest sponsor**.

- 20. Happy Anniversary! The Provincial Civil Service Association of B.C held their first annual convention in 1919. <u>After 100 years</u>, the **BC Government and Service Employees' Union (BCGEU)**, has over 79,000 members.
- 21. A record number of **schools** participated in the 2019 <u>Day of Mourning BC Schools</u> <u>Project</u>.
- 22. We celebrated **15 years of accomplishments**, paid tribute to retiring Chair, Bro. Ken Novakowski and welcomed our new Chair Joey Hartman at a dinner in Burnaby.
- 23. Watch: "The BC Labour Heritage Centre: Preserving Our Past, Preparing Our Future".
- 24. We added nine video interviews to our <u>Oral History Collection</u>. The collection is housed at Simon Fraser University Library and **viewable online**.
- 25. Our **e-newsletter** bursting with BC labour history was sent <u>every month</u> to over 1,400 subscribers.
